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The Chief Information Officer–Solutions and Partners 3 (CIO-SP3) Government-Wide Acquisition Contract (GWAC) is a 10-year Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (ID/IQ) contract with a \$20 billion ceiling. This contract is intended to provide information

technology (IT) solutions and services. The GWAC can be used by Federal, civilian, or DoD agencies. CIO-SP3 allows for streamlined planning, acquisition, and deployment of large-scale IT program requirements.
